Dear Antonio Park Families,

Thankyou to our amazing parent community for attending parent teacher-conferences last week. Whether you attended face to face or via Google Meet, we had a fantastic turnout. Parents shared valuable information about their child so that teachers can create effective relationships with, and rigorous learning programs for, each individual student. Thankyou for your efforts, parents. The relationship that develops between the student, the parent and the teacher is strengthened by the sharing of information and by regular communication. This is a vital cog in the wheel of APPS' effective learning community.

Weeks 3 and 4 have seen the students settle into their weekly classroom timetables and routines. We have seen soccer incursions for the Foundation to grade 2 students, and District swimming sports for some senior students following on from the House swimming sports two weeks ago. Voluntary programs like choir, running club, and Peacemakers have begun which expand the children's experiences and allow them to find passions and interests. Many more programs are 'waiting in the wings' and will be gradually introduced to the students.

Parent Liaison Program

As part of our School Council initiative 'Community Connections' we implement a Parent Liaison (P.L.) program each year, where each class has a nominated Parent Liaison. The P.L. liaises with the teacher to communicate classroom and school information to class parents and to create a sense of community within their class.

Parent Liaisons enjoy communicating and are keen to support the collaboration within the class and the school community.

We are now calling for Parent Liaison nominations. A Compass notice was sent out last Friday with a link to an Expression of Interest document. This nomination period finishes tomorrow so if you're interested in becoming a Parent Liaison for your child's class, please fill out the form.

This is a great opportunity for you to be involved, meet other parents and participate in the school community via your class in a relaxed and social environment.

School Council

School councils play an important role in Victorian government schools. A well-informed and effective school council strengthens community confidence in the school and helps to build the school's culture. At APPS, we have a hardworking and enthusiastic school council who meet approximately twice a term throughout the school year. Our school council is made up of parent members, as well as Department of Education and Training (DET) employees. Parent members bring their experience as parents at the school and the views of the wider school community to

school council meetings. DET employees bring their educational expertise to school council meetings.

At the beginning of each year some members of our school council finish their tenure. It is now time to fill three parent positions on the council and we are calling for nominations for these two year positions.

If you would like to self nominate or nominate another parent, please collect a form from the office or request a form be emailed to you. Nominations must be submitted by 4pm Thursday 4th March.

Compass Kiosk

We have recently installed a new Compass Kiosk (iPad) at the office to enable the faster and more efficient management of student and visitor sign in/sign out procedures. It is extremely user friendly and enables real time tracking of students and visitors entering and exiting the school. This now means that if your child will be arriving late or leaving early from school, you will only need to enter the details into the Kiosk when dropping off or picking up your child instead of ahead of time on your App. We are sure you will find this system a real time saver.

Assembly



Schedule 4 Notice of Election and Call for Nominations

CSEF Application 2022

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

If you are a current Healthcare Card Holder, you are eligible to apply for CSEF assistance. Please fill out a CSEF form at the office as soon as possible.

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Your child's school will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in 2021 or
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Schools are able to accept and process applications up until the end of term two each year.




