Year 2 Camp

Our Year 2 students set off on their first ever camp this week, winding through the bush to Stringybark Lodge in Gembrook. Greeted with blue skies, noisy kookaburras and truckloads of food, students were treated to a variety of adventures including a low ropes course, hut building, trampolining, mini golf, night hikes and a night time campfire. For many students this was their first camp experience and they are to be congratulated on the maturity they showed throughout. A huge thank you to our wonderful parent helpers as well who worked tirelessly to help make the students' experience a memorable one.

Camping Program at APPS

Antonio Park has run many quality camps over the years. Camps provide unique opportunities for students to develop independence, self management, along with important social skills. Our first Year 2 camp was very successful and we are looking forward to our upcoming 3/4 camp next week. As a school that prides itself on providing opportunities to students, we are happy to announce our camping program will continue with some changes next year. The school has been reviewing our 5/6 Canberra camp for a number of years now. Due to the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement, local school region policy, and increasing costs, we are unable to currently run 5 day camps. Next year, our 5/6 team have organised a 3 day Melbourne City camp. Antonio Park will continue to run a two day camp for Year 2 and 3 day camps for 3-6 students every year. The school understands that there may be disappointment around this development but I assure you that the 5/6 teachers have done a fantastic job planning an amazing experience for the students.

Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2022The Victorian Government School Agreement (VGSA) is now ratified and operational from Monday 25th July.

The new Agreement contains a range of new industrial requirements. One of these is known as **Time in Lieu**. This requirement is a response to the growing parental communications and after-hours meetings such as Parent/ Student/Teacher Conferences. More so, it is the varied extracurricular events offered by schools and this amount of unpaid work that the new EBA seeks to acknowledge.

It must be noted, in an industrial sense, extracurricular events are not part of a school's core work which is the delivery of the Victorian Curriculum. Extracurricular events are additional and have been provided by school staff, usually before or after hours through goodwill and to provide engaging opportunities for our students beyond that required by the curriculum.

We unequivocally support teachers being paid for work for

after-hours events; however parents should be aware that the government has stated that there will be no additional funding provided to schools to pay for Til.

It is certain that due to the requirement of TiL, there will be changes to how, when and if schools continue to provide the current range of extracurricular events, particularly camps. We will do all we can to ensure that our culture of community and opportunities for students aren't diluted by this agreement.

Changes to Instrumental Music Fees

A range of companies hire Antonio Park facilities to offer programs including sports, martial arts, music and after hours care. These businesses pay hire fees to the school. In the case of businesses offering music lessons, these fees help cover the cost of tuning pianos, maintaining and cleaning lesson rooms and other costs. One company who hires our facilities is Wonnies, a business that provides a music lessons service in schools across Melbourne. Recently, the school council asked Wonnies to also start paying a very small fee for using our facilities, as we do the other businesses who use our buildings.

The school understands that Wonnies has now raised the fees it charges for music lessons and are aware that this will be of concern to many families, particularly at a time of rising cost of living pressures. School Council is reviewing how the school can best facilitate access to music lessons for children and would be pleased to have feedback on families' experience of Wonnies, including affordability and customer service. Antonio Park Primary School believes that the opportunity to learn a musical instrument is important and would like to ensure that this continues to be available to as many children as possible.

Parent-Class Requests for 2023

At this time every year we give parents an opportunity to provide a letter explaining any special educational needs their child may have when transitioning into the next level. Information in this letter will be considered by the Principal as part of the process of grade placement for your child. A reminder that this letter must be in writing and emailed to the school, 'Attention: Carly Jones,' no later than **Friday 4th November**. Please note a specific request for a teacher is not offered. It is vital that information is put in writing in this way as opposed to just having conversations with your child's teacher so that we can ensure that we do not miss any important information

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New Basketball Courts

It has been wonderful seeing our students enjoy the newly resurfaced basketball courts these first few weeks of term. Students have loved the opportunity at recess and lunchtime to play basketball, four square and even just sit in the sun socialising. The new surfaces are not only pleasing to the eye but the softer surface also provides greater safety for our students.
