
ANZAC day commemorations

Visible Wellbeing

This year staff have begun Visible Wellbeing (VWB) training. The training is broken into a set of six modules Last term we were trained to use the Strengths module. A strength is defined as a positive quality/talent that is energising, that we choose to use and that we perform well. Strengths help us match ourselves and other people to our environments, and allows us to better meet challenges by utilising those qualities where we can be our best selves.

This Term, APPS teachers are using the strength practice across the school. Students in Grades 3-6 are completing the Junior VIA Character strength survey to identify their top strengths. They will then be encouraged to think about how to utilise these to maximise their learning and wellbeing. Students in Foundation to Grade Two are learning about different character strengths to assist with identifying their own personal strength and later in the term will become 'Strength Spotters.'

Strengths are a great tool to use in families and when parenting also – Professor Waters' book The Strength Switch is a wonderful place to start if you are wanting more information on how to use strength-based parenting in your homes!

Introducing Sayembara Lisan

This term students in Grades 3,4, 5 & 6 will be given the opportunity to participate in Sayembara Lisan. This is a state-wide Indonesian Speaking Competition. This prestigious competition is run by VILTA - Victorian Indonesian Language Teachers Association. Last year two of our own students excelled gaining 1st and 3rd places respectively for their age groups.

The competition features simple questions and instructions that students should be familiar with.

In addition students from Grades 3 & 4 will recite a poem. Students from Grades 5 & 6 will be asked to respond to a number of questions related to a picture prompt. We will be covering the material in class and there is no cost involved.

Interested students will register and practice with Ibu Rose during Weeks 1,2 and 3 of Term 2.

Students from Grades 3 and 4 will get the opportunity to polish their speaking skills on Mondays and Wednesdays at recess times. Students from Grades 5 & 6 will have additional practice time on Tuesdays and Thursdays at recess time.

The first round of competition will be held at school during Week 4. Bu Dowling who is an Indonesian teacher from Marlborough P.S will visit our school to judge students as part of the Maroondah region.

With any luck select students will be chosen to represent Antonio Park at the state finals on Saturday 22nd July.

Leading on from this an award ceremony will be held on Friday 11th August at a venue to be advised.





Kiss & Go Zones

Understanding the rules



Kiss & Go Zones are for your child's safety, your convenience and to minimise congestion and confusion.

A Kiss & Go Zone is a short term stopping area which will enable your child to walk between your car and the school, using the safety of the footpath.





Kiss & Go Zone Rules

Child safety

- Kiss & Go Zones and No Parking zones operate under the same conditions.
- You may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of two minutes.
- Drivers must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle.

Please ensure children get in

The zone applies only during the hours of operation stated on the No Parking sign.



Do not leave your vehicle

To assist with traffic flow. drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out. Children should travel with bags in the car (not in the boot).

Be timely

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within two minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go Zone.

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone. as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an

Driver duty of care

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

No U-turns

Do not do U-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk.




